Cleaning/Painting the Inside of the Water Tank:

The town's water tank needs to be repainted on the inside. This project will cost about \$130,000 to \$150,000. The town has put in a new generator and pressure system for this project. To complete this project the town will only be able to run off the wells, while the water tank is drained, cleaned, sanded and repainted. It will take approximately 2 to 4 weeks to complete. The council has decided to do this next year right after school is out. During this period, the residents will be asked to curb their water use. We will send out

more information when we gets closer to doing this project.

The town council has decided to put in an RV dump station on Washington Street. This will go in late summer/early fall.

Our recycling program has been very successful. Here is a reminder of what you can recycle.

Newspaper Bin Consists of:

Old Newspapers
Paper inserts
Magazines
Telephone Directories
Paperback Books
Catalogs
Office Paper
Tin Can Labels
Open Discarded Mail

Metal Cans Bin Consists of:

Aluminum Cans
Tin Cans
Metal Containers must be limited to 1 gallon size

*All containers must be opened and content free, loose tin lids must be discarded and paper labels removed and recycled.

Cardboard Bins Consists of:

Corrugated boxes
Paper Bags
Cereal and Food Boxes
Beverages Cases
Map and Dispenser Tubes


*Box tape and staples are OK. Please remove plastic liners and Styrofoam. Please flatten all boxes.

Mixed Plastic Bottles Bins Consist of:

Plastic bottles and or Jugs No. 1-7

- *All containers must have lids removed and discarded, be empty and have an opening or spout smaller than the bottom of the container. All labels may remain attached to plastic containers. Discard all plastic lids.
- *No paper or plastic bags or containers larger than 1.5 gallons or those used to contain paint, thinners, automotive products, hydrocarbons, fuel, pesticides and/or herbicides.
- *No glass of any kind or aluminum foil or wax or plastic laminated materials, aerosol type containers or those used to contain paint, hydro carbons, fuels, pesticides, and or herbicides.

The recycling containers are set right behind the Fire Department on Depot Street.
