Dog Licensing and Vaccinations

The Town of Colton's Ordinance #224 and #269 requires that a license be purchased for all dogs 6 months of age or older, that are harbored within the town. You may obtain a license at Town Hall. The cost of a lifetime dog license is \$15.00. Rabies vaccination records are maintained by the town and must be kept current. If you have just moved into town and have a dog, please stop by Town Hall and get your dog licensed. We are located at 706 Broadway Street. If you have questions, please call Jenni at 509 229-3887.

Uniontown Compost/Burn Pile:

If you need to get rid of yard wastes, remember that Uniontown's Composting area is opened and will remain opened as long as there is no inappropriate dumping. It is located across from McGregor's on Blair Street. Please remember to only drop off composting items.

This is a natural vegetation only site. Leaves, grass and weeds each have their own clearly designated pile. Tree limbs are accepted but must be smaller than 4 inches in diameter and no longer than 6 feet. NO construction lumber is allowed. Please do not put pine cones on the burn pile. This site is open 24 hours a day, but please follow all rules when dumping things off, so that this site will remain opened. Thank you.

Colton Watering Schedule:

Colton is on a water conservation program and has scheduled watering days for each side of town.

REMINDER OF WATERING DAYS:

Please only water on your scheduled days!

PUBLIC SCHOOL SIDE OF TOWN: <u>PLEASE WATER ON SUNDAY, WEDNESDAY</u> AND FRIDAY.

CHURCH SIDE OF TOWN: <u>PLEASE WATER ON TUESDAY, THURSDAY AND SATURDAY.</u>

Block Watch:

The council has had some discussion about starting a Block Watch group. The town would be willing to provide signs, if neighbors would like to get together to set this up.

Chickens:

Please remember per Ordinance #491, Fowl not to exceed Six (6) per property of any one or combination thereof the following: chickens, pheasants, pigeons, ducks. They must be cooped, no free range fowl are allowed. No Roosters are Allowed.



Recycling in Colton



The town's recycling bins are located behind the Fire Department on Depot Street. Here is a reminder of what you can recycle.

Newspaper Bin Consists of: Old Newspapers Paper inserts Magazines Telephone Directories Paperback Books Catalogs Office Paper Tin Can Labels Open Discarded Mail

Metal Cans Bin Consists of: Aluminum Cans Tin Cans Metal Containers must be limited to 1 gallon size

*All containers must be opened and content free, loose tin lids must be discarded and paper labels removed and recycled.

Cardboard Bins Consists of:

Corrugated boxes

Paper Bags

Cereal and Food Boxes

Beverages Cases

Map and Dispenser Tubes

*Box tape and staples are OK. Please remove plastic liners and Styrofoam. Please flatten all boxes.

NOT ALLOWED:

- *No plastic of any kind
- *No aluminum foil or wax paper
- *No glass of any kind
